## Registered Volunteer Supervisors

Greetings from USBC Headquarters!

You, the Registered Volunteer Supervisor, served a very important role in the development and growth of the Registered Volunteer Program. As you know, there are many exciting changes taking place in the USBC Youth programs and while your role will change you still play a vital role in protecting USBC Youth members.

To help you gain a better understanding of the changes here is a recap of what will happen beginning Aug. 1, 2009:

### New

#### Beginning July 1, 2009:

RVS pre-enrollment of volunteers will be discontinued. A 30-day window is needed to overhaul the systems, eliminate overlapping information and assist associations in finalizing accounts.

#### Beginning Aug. 1, 2009:

- All volunteers, including you, who wish to participate in the RVP will do so online and will pay by credit card.
- The cost still will be \$20 for the screening however, the administrative fees will be lowered from \$5 to \$1.25.
- There may be additional screening fees if your state or county charge NCSI additional fees.
- The volunteer may be reimbursed if their fees ultimately are handled by their association or proprietor.
- NCSI will directly e-mail volunteers when it's time to renew.

### Same

- NCSI will continue the screening process and maintain the confidentiality of the volunteer's information.
- The criteria used for screening will remain the same.
- USBC will send the volunteer a USBC lanyard and badge.
- Badges are good for two years.
- Registered Volunteers will be listed on bowl.com.

## How will you know if a person is a "Red Light or Green Light?"

There are two great ways! First, make sure no one works with USBC Youth without a current USBC RVP Badge. Second, you can check to make sure they are current on bowl.com.

### Here's how you can still help:

- Because the program will be user-direct, you and your association will spend less time administering the program allowing for more time working with the youth.
- Visit your centers and explain the program and the changes.
- Encourage your centers to remain vigilant and only allow people with current USBC RVP badges to work with USBC Youth.
- Continue to visit your centers and notify the proper people (League official, center management, etc.) if people working with USBC Youth are not current Registered Volunteers.

While you will no longer be a Registered Volunteer Supervisor you still have an integral role in USBC Youth programs. We thank you for all you have done to make this program a success and appreciate your continued work with our youth.
